Mr. Ken Rattenbury, "Way Doon Yonder", 299 Birainghan Roed, WALSALL, West Midlands WS5 301 , England, reports the University or Keele has accepted him to prepare a Thesis mit "The music of Dake Ellimstoan. This requiers exhaustive exanination of the Ellington modus operandi, and moticaleas transcription from recordings in support of the sutnissions and analyses. What is especielly hoped for is to be fertunate enough to have sight of original scores in photocopy, or to discover pablished versions in archestral form. Ken has had fifty years in jazs, starting on piane when he was 19, jazz being youns then, and so vas Ellington. After a lifotime of professional music-aking as a truapet-playor/ /pianist/composar, motivated by a love of the very best in jass, he was undertaking the above task, anil he is reporting he has so far transcribed six Duke recordings to full mosical score, thinking this may we helpral to foture students of Ellington, mbecuese there de not soea to be full musical scores of Dake anymere elson. This is a morthmile task and his 40 years as a profosaienal memician, also as arranger is proving nost helpfol to him.
